ANP COLLABORATIVE PRACTICE AGREEMENT

XYZ HEALTH CARE CENTER

Pursuant to New Jersey Reg 45:11-49 and section 12 of P.L. 1991, c 377 (C.4511-51), this document is a collaborative practice agreement between the advanced practice nurse, name of APN, here-in-after known as the APN, and the collaborating physician, name of collaborating physician, here-in-after known as the CP. In so signing this document, the parties agree to collaborate in the delivery of the full range of primary health care services for persons across the lifespan, as governed by their respective education, training, and experience and in accordance with state law within the practice known as name of practice or agency maintains offices in city 1 and city 2

Standards of practice, record keeping methodology for patient encounters and for prescriptions will be followed for all patients as established by **practice or agency**. (alternative wording: "will be observed for all patients as follows: _______"). Emergency procedures for purposes of emergency as established by **practice or agency** will be followed. (alternative wording "for purposes of emergency as follows _______"). The parties agree to practice in accordance with New Jersey regulatory statues for licensure and their respective certifying bodies.

Pharmacologic categories from which the APN may prescribe without restriction, unless limited by state law, are described in Appendix A. to this agreement. Physician direction in prescribing the therapeutics listed in Appendix A shall be within the judgment of the APN. In accordance with the regulatory statues noted above, Appendix A shall be reviewed and/or updated annually by the APN and CP.

Initiating physician consultation concerning all aspects of patient care is within the judgment of the APN. Periodic peer review of patient records will be performed on an ongoing basis at the discretion of the CP who will do so in accordance with **practice or agency** policy for record review. (alternative wording: "who will do so as follows: _______"). In addition, the CP or his/her designee agrees to be available for consultation on an individual basis, as needed. When the CP is unavailable for consultation during scheduled or emergency time off, **name of physician designated to cover** shall be designated as the collaborating physician for purposes of this agreement. The means of communication with the collaborating physician shall be in person or via telecommunication from any location wherein **practice or agency** patients are being evaluated.

Practice protocols will be implemented according to the principles and clinical practice directives and/or guidelines delineated within in any of the mutually agreed upon references listed in Appendix B to this agreement. The references may be accessed by physical or electronic means. Choosing and implementing specific medical diagnostic and treatment modalities contained within these references shall be within the judgement of the APN. In accordance with the regulatory statues noted above, Appendix B shall be reviewed and/or updated annually by the APN and CP. ANP will consult with CP for prescriptive practice which falls outside the approved list of agents (Appendix A) or outside the guidelines delineated in the agreed-upon references (Appendix B). Otherwise, prescriptive consultation with the CP shall be at the judgement of the APN.
